

PROCLAMATION
BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF WOODBURY
PROCLAIMING ARBOR DAY IN THE CITY OF WOODBURY

WHEREAS, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

WHEREAS, this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and

WHEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling cost, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas and beautify our community; and

WHEREAS, trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal; and

WHEREAS, the City of Woodbury is committed to preserving and propagating trees in our community.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED THAT, The Mayor and Council of the City of hereby proclaim Friday, April 30, 2021 as *Arbor Day* in the City of Woodbury, and we urge all citizens to celebrate Arbor Day and to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands.

FURTHER THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED THAT, we urge all residents of The City of Woodbury to become active in planting and protecting trees for the benefit of this and future generations.
